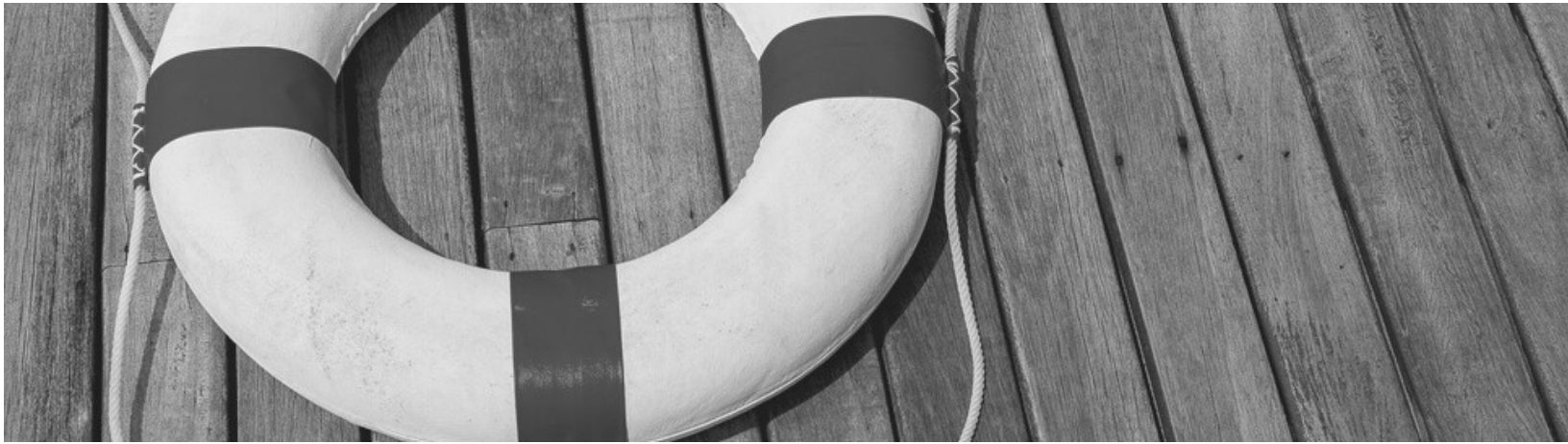


Layperson Naloxone Administration



Course Overview

What You Will Learn

Recognize: The signs of an opioid overdose.

Acquire: Knowledge of how to administer the opioid overdose reversal drug Naloxone.

Understand: The role of harm reduction in the overall opioid public health crisis solutions / action plan / strategy.
