Ardmore Environmental Camp




During the month of May, the SCOPE team stayed busy at the Ardmore Environmental Camp with the middle school students of Ardmore Public Schools. The SCOPE team had the opportunity to teach almost 200 students materials from the Botvin Lifeskills prescription drug abuse and vaping modules.

Our project lead, Diana Flood, created a name for the students while at the camp - The Wise OWLs, which stood for 'Observe, Weigh, and Lead.' Staying on theme, Diana engaged students with a camp chant - "Hoot hoot!" When in class or driving around after hours, Diana would roll down her window and shout, "Can I get a hoot hoot?!" In which the students cheered back emphatically - "HOOT HOOT!"



The SCOPE-OK/Botvin class quickly picked up steam throughout the camp - students were chatting about the class before even arriving! We were able to engage the students not only through the Botvin curriculum but also through drug-impairment goggles.



The SCOPE team had the students tell us their 'why' for why they don't want to misuse drugs or tobacco products. Pictured above are some of the students' responses!

The Oklahoma Alliance for Recovery Residences (OKARR) is the Oklahoma state affiliate of the National Alliance for Recovery Residences (NARR). To that effect, OKARR:

- Links individuals seeking and sustaining recovery from substance use issues with quality recovery housing through our locator
- Promotes the quality of recovery housing by offering training and resources to recovery housing providers and workforce
- Certifies recovery housing that meets national best practice
- Organizes the recovery housing and stakeholder communities



What is a recovery residence?

Recovery housing is a family-like, shared living environment free from alcohol and illicit drug use and centered on peer support and connection to services that promote sustained recovery from substance use disorders. They go by different names, and their history can be traced back to the mid-1800s!
